



Ground Rules

Parking

- Please respect parking attendants and be prepared to follow their directions
- Parking zones will be shared on social media so that contestants are aware of which parking and stalling zone there are located: Infield or MegaDome
- When parking in zones, abide by designated parking lines to assure maximum parking efficiencies and proper spacing
- Day parking may be made available for certain contestants for overflow stalling
- No parking allowed in fire lanes and loading zones

Stalling

- Stalling maps will be shared on social media so that contestants are aware of which stalling zone they are located: Infield or MegaDome
- Stalls are labeled, numbered and have emergency contact information on them; no stalling requests or movement of stalls
- After check in and registration, all trailers to unload horses and promptly move to the designated trailer parking areas
- Bagged Shavings can be pre-purchased or purchased onsite for \$10 per bag and booked through Stalling Manager; pick up time is 5pm daily at Kiwanis barn; cash only
- No self-penning permitted on site at any time
- Bathing of horses in washracks only
- Please push stalls out after use
- No tying to chainlink fence, racetrack fencing or any other portable objects
- Take caution when crossing 54th Street to attend performance area

Pets

- Pets MUST be on leash at all times; must be respectful of neighbors and traffic flow

Alcohol, Cannabis & Stimulants

- There will be NO consumption of stimulants whether alcohol, smoking, cannabis, vaping or e-cigarettes permitted onsite, indoors or outdoors, during ASHRA programming

Damages

- Any alterations/damages to sites, stalls, equipment grounds or buildings will result in a damage fee.

Program

- Contestants abide by all Alberta High School Rodeo Association Rules and Regulations at all times of programming
- Rodeo draws and results will be posted in the Cow Palace and adjacent to the Rodeo Office daily
- Contestants must be in dress code in any performance area at all times
- Contestants must attend all necessary contestant meetings
- ORE contestants and rodeo officials must abide by the IAFE National Code of Ethics
- Contestants and guests must comply with Town of Olds Noise Bylaw: 10pm-7am
