# Economic Impact

ORE is a vibrant and dynamic driver of economic impact in the region contributing to local business including accommodations, food & beverage, retail, farm supplies, fuel, etc.

## Financiai Management

A sixteen year operational comparative analysis demonstrates the challenges and pressures facing ORE's operations. 505% increase in wages & salaries, 462% increase in utility costs and 179% increase in insurance with rather static funding and facility rental revenues makes this business model rather unsustainable.


